ISBN: 9780415420303 Dealing with this new and controversial area, this is the first comprehensive guide to religious discrimination and hatred legislation. Exploring part two of the Equality Act and the Racial and Religious Hatred Act, Addison examines the fundamental differences between religion and race which make the operation of these new

The Openwork Foundation Cares 4 Kids Charity Cycle Challenge



The Challenge

The challenge was to ride 408k along the banks of the Nile over 5 days, which also included a detour through the desert in heat sapping temperatures in excess of 90f. and two extremely long days both over 100k in distance. In addition to the 33 fundraisers, were Midge Story of the Openwork Foundation, Tony Clarke, team doctor, Peter Arnold, team mechanic and Phil Kool, team manager, making a total of 37 riders in all.

Training

I started training again this year in April with my good friend and cycling companion Brian Harding (Croydon Financial Services). Since returning from South Africa in November 2005, our bikes had remained in hibernation and we were both quite pleasantly surprised to find that we had retained some strength in our legs following a five-month break. We went from eight miles to twenty-four in three weeks and things were looking good. However, in early June, Brian injured his back quite seriously and he was unable to ride again until towards the end of August. I kept up some training each week on my own, but simply was not doing the necessary miles that I would have done had we been riding together. There was also the dangerous thought lurking in my mind (and as I later discovered also in the minds of other veterans) that at least this year the challenge would be largely flat, unlike the 'alps' that we had to negotiate in South Africa in 2005. At the end of August, Brian was feeling better allowing serious training to commence and we went from 15 miles to 40 in four weeks and did at least manage a couple of 50 milers in the last couple of weeks before the challenge.

Saturday 28th October London - Cairo

We assembled at Heathrow Airport for 3 pm flight to Cairo. This was something of a reunion as many of us had ridden together in South Africa last year. One notable omission was Pat McGirl, who sadly passed away this year at the age of 45. Pat was a larger than life character and a warm and generous man and his absence from the group was conspicuous to all of those that knew him. Four of us had brought our own bikes, which made checking in quite interesting, but Egypt Air were helpful and obliging and no extra charges were levied. The flight lasted 4 hours 50 minutes and we were met at Cairo Airport by our team leader Phil Kool. From there we transferred to the Zoser Partner Hotel, which had pleasant chalet style accommodation and thankfully air conditioning. It was also situated just a stone's throw from the Great Pyramids. My good friend Roger Cook (Mayer Brown) and I had agreed to be roommates for the trip as had become the custom on previous charity rides and that evening we also had to share our room with two extremely large bags containing our bicycles!

It is worth mentioning that great care is taken to safeguard tourists in Egypt. All the hotels, restaurants and museums that we visited had airport style portals, which we had to walk through when entering or leaving.



Sunday 29th October Cairo - Luxor

The day started with breakfast at 8am and shortly after 9am we boarded a coach to visit the Great Pyramids of Giza. It is hardly surprising that these pyramids are considered to be one of the Seven Wonders of the World. The sheer size of these structures built around 2560 BC is quite amazing. When it was built, the Great pyramid was 145.75 m (481 ft) high. It ranked as the tallest structure on Earth for more than 43 centuries. The sloping angle of its sides is 51 degrees and 51 minutes. Each side is carefully oriented with one of the cardinal points of the compass. The horizontal cross section of the pyramid is square at any level, with each side measuring 229 m (751 ft) in length. The maximum error between side lengths is astonishingly less than 0.1%.

The structure consists of approximately 2 million blocks of stone, each weighing more than two tons. It has been suggested that there are enough blocks in the three pyramids to build a 3 m (10 ft) high, 0.3 m (1 ft) thick wall around France!

We then reboarded the bus for a short ride to the Sphinx. I personally found this structure even more awesome than the pyramids. When discovered in recent history only the famous head was visible above the sand. Today, the entire body of the Sphinx has been excavated, it is truly huge! It is believed that many more structures may be buried here beneath the sand, maybe it is said, even vaults containing unknown treasures! The sun was beginning to grow in strength, a warning if we needed one of how hot it would be when we began our cycle challenge the next day. We also had time to visit the Museum of Cairo, a papyrus factory and also a local street market. In the evening we caught the 8pm flight for Luxor. At Luxor we joined the Nile river cruise boat 'Ninfea' which was to become our home for the rest of our stay. We found our cabins and later met in the bar for the first of our evening briefings by Midge Story and a run down of the following day's events by our team leader Phil Kool.

Monday 30th October: Day 1 of the Challenge, Esna – Edfu: 52 km

We sailed through the night and awoke to cries from locals in small boats calling up to us trying to sell their wares. How they were supposed to achieve this from 30 feet below us nobody seemed to know. We were moored just below the great lock at Esna, waiting for the gates to open. Once through, we had a pleasant cruise in the sunshine until we arrived at Esna town itself, where the majority of the riders were fitted out with their bikes. Those four of us that had brought our own assembled our machines watched over by Pete Arnold, the team mechanic. And so it was that just after 1pm, we finally set off on our first 52k of the challenge. The support team spread out ahead of us, stopping traffic at busy junctions and waving us through as we rode through the bustling streets of Esna. People stared at us in amazement and the children shouted 'hello and welcome'. We headed out into the countryside along the banks of the Nile on what was a generally good surface, escorted by a police motorcycle outrider and also a covered pickup truck with half a dozen more police inside. The support team pointed out potholes and railway lines crossing the road. This didn't prevent Allan Boothroyd meeting his first challenge when he became dismounted crossing one particular track, but he was uninjured and rode on. After only a few kilometres, the team spirit was already beginning to show through. From front to back, we rode in groups,

encouraging each other along and by the time we arrived at our first water break it was evident that the camaraderie was already building. In fact, this was a very enjoyable and straight forward first day of riding for the group and we arrived at Edfu just after 5 pm, well ahead of schedule. So much so, that we had outstripped our cruise boat which was supposed to have been waiting for our arrival. Coffee and cake was served as we waited in the late afternoon sun and all seemed well in the world. Just before 6pm we wit-



nessed a beautiful sunset over the Nile, but as the sun went in, the mosquitoes came out and many people began to get bitten. Being unusually organised I remembered that I had some insect repellent in my bag and hastily applied it only to find a huge queue forming beside me. It was too late for Laura Price however as she seemed to have been chosen as an oeur deurve by these voracious insects. Eventually our cruise boat Ninfea drew along side, but it seemed like an age until we climbed aboard its air-conditioned sanctuary! I felt that this day had been something of a test, to see how we could ride and how well we performed as a team. That evening Phil Kool, the team leader announced at the after dinner briefing that we were a 'fast group' which partly explained how we had become so far ahead of the Ninfea.

Tuesday 31st October: Day 2 of the Challenge, Edfu – Aswan: 110 km

With an alarm call at 5.30 am, we set off at 7 am for what was to be an extremely long day of riding. Roger Cook continued his 'training on the job' technique, and I wondered to myself in amazement at how anyone could do this. This was also danger day for Claire Gardner, who traditionally falls off on day 2! She survived, but did become a victim of bikers bum. Fortunately, Dr Tony (buttocks a speciality) Clarke was on hand to administer pain relief. Newcomers such as Kym Turvey rode fanatically and the petite Sam Kent was obviously very fit! We followed the road along the Nile for about twenty minutes before turning off onto a road that led us into the desert. We stopped every hour or so for water breaks but by 10 am it was already becoming extremely hot. All we could see ahead was a long strip of shimmering tarmac and sand, sand! This was a time to form smaller groups and ride at our own



preferred pace, but by midday. we were beginning to become badly spaced out. From time to time we could see the lush banks of the Nile in the distance, which somehow made the increasing heat even more intense. Just before 1pm we were directed down a dirt track where our amazing support team had erected a huge protective awning close to the river so that we could enjoy our lunch in the shade. We set off again around 2.30pm. The sun was still blisteringly hot and the tarmac surface seemed to reflect

the heat as we cycled along through the desert, stopping periodically for water breaks. Turning back towards the Nile, we finally left the desert behind us. It was a relief to have trees and vegetation around us, which did a least offer some protection from the sun. A few gentle hills lay before us but these turned out to be nothing more than 'undulations'. Our final water break was at a colourful Nubian house. We set off again for the last part of the days ride, looking forward to meeting the boat at Aswan. Extra care had to be taken as the sun was becoming low and was directly in our eyes. Also we were all quite tired which meant that there was a

danger of losing concentration, but we made it safely back to our final destination opposite Aswan having completed 110k. After being served coffee and cake, we and our bikes were ferried over to the opposite bank where we joined The Ninfea for the night.

Wednesday 1st November: Day 3 of the Challenge, Aswan to the High Dam: 52km

We awoke at 6.00am for a 7.15 start, for what was to be a half-day ride to the Aswan High Dam and back, a mere 52k. We set off in convoy through the town of Aswan. The ground support team guided us through the busy streets and the police escort alerted people of our approach. We were greeted by waves and shouts of hello as we negotiated the town and headed up a short sharp assent to the lower dam, first built by the British in 1889. Due to the irregular flooding pattern of the Nile River and increased water demands, the dam had to be raised on 2 occasions in 1912 and 1933. The Police closed the road whilst we traversed this dam en masse. As we crossed, we could see the High Dam towering dauntingly above us in the distance. On the far side, the road immediately began to snake and climb towards our destination and for the first time on this years challenge, we hit a serious hill. Readers of my previous cycle challenge articles about Cuba and South Africa will know that, 'I don't do hills' therefore I was grateful that I had gone to all the trouble of bringing my own bike. For the first time, my trusty Land Rover Defender bicycle complete with 27 gears came into its own. Ignoring good natured cries of 'cheat' from some of my fellow cyclists, I sped up the hill to arrive in 5th place – at my age; I need all the help I can get! The Aswan High Dam is a technical marvel, built in the 1960's by the Russians. It is over 4 kms long, approximately 1km thick at its base and towers 107 metres above sea level. The lake it has created. Lake Nasser, is the largest man made lake in the world, stretching back 500kms into Sudan. The hydro electricity it produces powers the whole of Egypt. We returned via the temple complex of Philae. This temple was destined to have been lost with the rising waters caused by the High Dam but it was saved when every stone was numbered and block by block the temple was rebuilt on higher ground. We cycled back to the boat for an afternoon sail back up the Nile, to Kom Ombo.

Thursday 2nd November: Day 4 of the Challenge, Kom Ombo – Esna: 122km

This was to be the big one -122k but some with trip meters, reckoned it was nearer 130k. We awoke at 5.00am and set off at 6.30am in order to reach our destination before nightfall. We passed many towns and villages as this side of the Nile is far more populated. Phil Kool informed us that as far as possible, we would ride 20k sections between breaks. Despite this being our longest day we set off in good spirits and at quite a pace. After the second water break, I was beginning to hit a 'personal wall'. My hands were beginning to ache badly, mainly because I am unable to ride one handed and was not able to gain any relief from doing so. My legs were not tired, but I was feeling pretty exhausted mentally and I could see hills in the distance. I just felt I'd had enough and wanted to get off. Suddenly a guardian angel appeared beside me, it was Jacqui Hardy. She must have sensed that I was flagging badly and set about talking to me non-stop and insisting that I responded to everything she said. Before I knew it, we were over the hills and far away, so thank you Jacqui for being there. This of course, was typical of the strong bond that had been forged amongst our group. We all helped each other along the way and acted as a team throughout. The cycling conditions were not ideal as the road surface was very uneven making it hard to ride. Bad head and side winds, always the cyclists enemy and the consequent whipping up of dust in our eyes and throats, made the water breaks even more welcome than usual. As I approached one of the final water stops, I noticed a large group of riders standing around apparently eating Magnums and Cornetto ice creams. Clearly I was exhausted and suffering from the heat, but it was true! A roadside shop was selling these wonderful delicacies at an amazing rate. The smiles on our faces were matched equally by the smile on the vendor's face, not to mention his rapidly bulging pockets! The only real emergency of this year's trip was when Keith Wilson, probably one of the most experienced cyclists amongst us, failed to notice that the escorting police pick up truck had suddenly stopped and he rode straight into the back of it. His face was badly gashed and there was a spectacular amount of blood. Doctor Tony took him back to the boat and stitched him up. The cut required seven stitches and I was left with the thought that there must be a much easier and less painful way of getting a lift than that! The only other incident of the day was about 5km from the end of the ride when I had my now 'traditional' puncture. However Pete Arnold our team mechanic and the ever enthusiastic Egyptian support team were on hand to assist and he and I rode into Esna in time to catch up with the tail enders. Despite these mishaps, we all managed to arrive back about an hour in front of schedule to be welcomed by town's people lining the streets to greet us. That evening despite our longest ride of the



challenge, we held a fancy dress night, which was quite hilarious. Many dressed as Arabs of course, but also present were Thunderbirds, Pirates of the Caribbean Cat Woman, and an alarmingly realistic Austin Powers!

Friday 3rd November: Day 5 of the Challenge, Esna – Luxor 80km

Up at 6am and away by 7.30am, so today started with a bit of a lie in! The temperature began to rise rapidly though and it was hot and dusty work as we rode along the banks of the Nile. After 40k I was beginning to experience quite bad stomach cramps and fearing the worst stopped briefly to down an Imodium, just in case the dreaded Egyptian tummy had finally caught up with me. I was feeling very tired, the cumulative effects of four days of riding were starting to catch up with me, so that morning I was largely riding on 'automatic', up until lunchtime. It had become a personal challenge for me rather than a team one. I was aware of my fellow cyclists around me, but I just tried to focus on the road ahead - I just had to keep going. After about 55k I saw a group of riders coming towards me, surely this was not another mad bunch out on a cycle challenge? As they approached, I realised that it was in fact the lead riders of our group, who had missed a turning and were heading back down the road in my direction. The rest of us turned to join them and shortly after that we arrived at our lunch break dominated by the spectacular Colossi of Memnon. These colossi (see front cover) are 21 metres tall and once marked the entrance to an ancient temple, but now stand alone. After lunch, we set of for the penultimate ride of the day 'down' to the Valley of the Kings. It was now extremely hot and we all struggled convinced that our tyres must be 'sticking' to the tarmac. However, it transpired that most of us at least were experiencing an optical illusion, caused by the surrounding hills as we were in fact riding uphill -avery bewildering experience! We arrived at the Valley of the Kings and were able to visit three of the sixty-three known tombs, though there are thought to more hidden beneath the



sand. Each tomb had been carved out by hand using nothing more than a hammer and chisel. The entrance halls would be more in keeping within a palace and the carvings and painting on the walls are quite remarkable. After this we remounted our bikes and headed off for the last part of our ride and this time it was definitely down hill. There were whoops of joy as we freewheeled at great speed towards our final destination. Just before we entered the town. we stopped to regroup. The yellow T Shirt of the day worn by Rosie Holmes (awarded for bravely cycling the previous day despite severe tummy problems) was to lead, followed by the ladies and then the men. We crossed the finishing line having completed, what we later discovered was 450k in all. Medals of achievement were awarded and Egyptian Champagne flowed as we congratulated each other on a job well done. That night we held our gala dinner and many of the team entertained us afterwards with a show as we celebrated together.

Saturday 4th November - Luxor

A day to ourselves and a chance to unwind. Some went on a hot air balloon; many of us toured the ancient Temple of Karnak. This ancient site once covered over 200 acres and is thought to be the largest temple complex in the world. Even today, what remains is truly amazing and the Hall of Columns is of particular note. The sheer height and size of these is quite remarkable and much of the painting upon them is still clearly visible. The afternoon was spent relaxing round the pool, touring Luxor or going for a ride on a Falouka, an Egyptian sailing boat. That night we went to dinner at the Old Winter Palace Hotel in Luxor a splendid colonial affair built in 1886 to attract the nobility of Europe.





Sunday 5th November, Luxor - Cairo - London

We arose at 3am for our long journey home. First a flight from Luxor to Cairo and then a connection to London. We arrived at Heathrow at 12.35pm tired but still elated by what we had achieved. We said our fond farewells and headed home.

Epilogue

This year we had to contend with few 'undulations' compared to the hills of Cuba or the mountains of South Africa. Those we did encounter were manageable, even the climb to the Aswan High Dam was short and sharp. By far the most challenging inclines were lifting our heads from our pillows no later than 6am at the start of each cycling day and 3am on the Sunday we returned – especially after several late nights! The heat, dust and two extremely long days in particular were a challenge, but the organization of the ground support was superb and staying on board the Nile cruiser during the trip meant that for once we were not living out of suit cases during the challenge.

The group had an excellent mix of 'Veterans and Virgins'. It wasn't long before we became and excellent team, experience blending perfectly with the enthusiasm of the new recruits. The veterans, possibly lulled by the thought of the easier terrain this year had probably not trained quite as hard as the virgins, who rode with great determination. The youngest in the group was 27 and eleven were aged between 50 and 60 years of age. The ladies are once again to be congratulated for their grit and determination, frequently putting we men to shame with their will to succeed. Familiar faces such as Rosie, Sonia BJ, Claire, Penny, Donna and Jacqui, had to contend with the eager determination of Laura, Kym and the small but perfectly formed power house of Sam Kent! We men of course were splendid, but no one was more splendid than our video man Brian Harding. It is easy to forget, that he must have ridden considerably further than the rest of us with his constant cycling up and down our group to capture memories of the trip

It focuses on the (regional) developments of treaties and on 'soft law' and 'best practice

recommendations' published by organisations like IMF. World Bank and INSOL International This is followed by an overview of the current Dutch International Insolvency Law. Also thoroughly discussed is the UNCITRAL Model Law on Cross-Border Insolvency, including comments on Chapter 15 of the United States Bankruptcy Code, in force since October 2005, and the draft of the English Cross-Border Insolvency Regulations 2006. The fourth chapter covers an elaborate analysis of the EU Insolvency Regulations, including 150 cases from ten jurisdictions together with foreign literature. The book contains an observation on the development of the future international insolvency laws, an extensive bibliography and a list of relevant websites.

CHINA'S PSYCHIATRIC INQUISITION Dissent, Psychiatry and the Law in Post-1949 China

Robin Munro

This study examines the misuse of forensic psychiatry custody in China since the late 1950s as an adjunct means – alongside the legal authorities' more frequent use of arrest, trial and imprisonment – of punishing and silencing political dissidents, spiritual nonconformists, whistleblowers and other critics of official corruption or malfeasance. The principal questions addressed in the book are: how common have such practices been in China during the successive main periods in the country's post-1949 history; how have these repressive practices been theorized and handled under the country's evolving criminal justice system; and why have the security authorities resorted to this, at first sight, uncharacteristically sophisticated form of state repression? On the basis of extensive archival research into several decades of China's legal and psychiatric literature, the study concludes that the use of psychiatric custody against dissidents and other similar groups has been more widespread in China than it was in the former Soviet Union.

The owner of any property, however small, in England or Wales, can be liable in certain circumstances to pay for repairs to the chancel of a medieval parish church in his locality. Until a recent case decided in the House of Lords led to a farmer and his wife being called on to pay a £95,000 bill, many property owners, conveyancers and parochial church councils had ignored this apparently remote corner of the law. Now, especially as a result of the Land Registration Act 2002, chancel repair liability has become a live issue.

The need for searches to establish whether any particular land may be affected is increasingly recognised. This book — the first of its kind — provides practical information on how to make these searches.
