



Ahdar, Rex and Leigh, Ian, *Religious Freedom in the Liberal State*, Oxford Univ Press, HB, £60.00, 0199253625


There is a growing recognition of the challenge that religions pose for pluralist, multicultural democracies. 'Fundamentalist' beliefs and practices test the limits of religious freedom, and seem to contradict the very basis on which liberal states protect religious liberty. Religions, moreover, are often associated with intolerance and persecution, yet insist upon religious liberty for themselves. This book inverts these stereotypes by present-

ing a sustained critique of how religious liberty ought to be understood in liberal legal systems and develops an alternative, Christian response.



Alexander, Kern; Dhumale, Rahul and Eatwell, John, *Global Governance of Financial Systems: International Regulation of Systemic Risk*, Oxford Univ Press, HB, £26.99, 0195166981  
The book sets forth the economic rationale for international financial regulation and what role, if any, international regulation can play in effectively managing systemic risk while providing accountability to all

affected nations. The book suggests that a particular type of global governance structure is necessary to have more efficient regulation of the international financial systems.







The law in relation to elements of the wider criminal justice system is examined, including the prison and probation services. The aim of the book is to examine English sentencing law in its context, drawing not only upon legislation and the decisions of the courts but also upon the findings of research and on theoretical justifications for punishment. This new edition has been extensively revised to integrate the new laws introduced by the Criminal Justice Act 2003, which has brought sweeping reforms into English sentencing.

A concise account of international law by an experienced practitioner, this book explains how states and international organisations, especially the United Nations, make and use international law. The nature of international law and its fundamental concepts and principles are described. The difference and relationship between various areas of international law, which are often misunderstood (such as diplomatic and state immunity, and human rights and international humanitarian law) are clearly explained. The essence of new specialist areas of international law, relating to the environment, human rights and terrorism

are discussed. Aust's clear and accessible style makes the subject understandable to non-international lawyers, non-lawyers and students. Abundant references are provided to sources and other materials, including authoritative and useful websites.





Africa, with its mix of statute, custom and religion is at the centre of the debate about law and its impact on gender relations. This is because of the centrality of the gender question and its impact on the cultural relativism debate within human rights. It is therefore important to examine critically the role of law, broadly constructed, in African societies. The book focuses on women's


experiences in the family. This is because the lives of women continue to be lived out largely in the private domain where the right to privacy is used to conceal unequal treatment of women which is justified by invoking “custom” and “tradition”. The book shows how law and its interpretation is used to disenfranchise women, resulting in their being deprived of land and other property which they may have helped to accumulate. It also considers issues of violence within the home and examines the issue of female genital cutting. A major theme of the book is a consideration of the linkages of constitutional and international human rights norms with local values. This is done using feminist tools of analysis. The book considers the provisions of the Protocol to the African Charter on Human and People’s Rights on the Rights of Women which was adopted by the African Union in July 2003.

Bartlett, Peter, *Blackstone’s Guide to the Mental Capacity Act 2005*, Oxford Univ Press, PB, £29.95, 0199289034  
The Mental Capacity Act 2005 comes into force in



2007 and radically reforms the law under which decisions will be made for those who lack mental capacity. Changes are wide-ranging and significant and include: a new functional capacity test; the primacy of ‘best interests’; the creation of a new Court of Protection; and a new criminal offence of ill-treatment or wilful neglect. This practical guide contains a copy of the Act and examines both the impact of the changes introduced and the principles and key concepts. It is an invaluable resource for all practitioners working in this complex area.



The author offers two alternative models of suggested choice of law rules in property, introducing a greater degree of flexibility into choice of law rules in property, and formulates even-handed solutions to the complex problems of space, time and policy which arise in this area of the conflict of laws.



In an era where States are increasingly challenging the logic of simply assimilating refugees to their own citizens, questions are now being raised about whether refugees should be allowed to enjoy freedom of movement, to work, to access public welfare programs, or to be reunited with family members. Doubts have been expressed about the propriety of exempting refugees from visa and other immigration rules, and whether there is a duty to admit refugees at all. Hathaway links the standards of the UN Refugee Convention to key norms of international human rights law, and applies his analysis to the world's most difficult protection challenges. This is a critical resource for advocates, judges, and policymakers. It will also

be a pioneering scholarly work for graduate students of international and human rights law.



### **Privilege, 2nd edition**

The scope of the two main heads of privilege have only recently been settled by the Courts, notwithstanding that privilege can be traced back many hundreds of years. With the Three Rivers case, the position is now clearer as the author describes in the new edition of this, the leading work on the subject which examines privilege in all its aspects in terms which will appeal to the practitioner and academic alike. The new edition comprehensively covers such areas as advice privilege, litigation privilege, and sharing privilege, as well as issues such as pre-existing documents, joint and common interests and losing privilege. Extensive coverage is also given to the position of agents and third parties, the crime-fraud exception, and issues surrounding claiming privilege and waiving privilege. ### **The Executive and Public Law: Power and Accountability in Comparative Perspective**

For most of the past two hundred years or more - the grand era of national constitution-making - founding fathers and constitutional scholars alike seem to have focused more sharply on questions of legislative power than they have on executive power. Executive power, by contrast, they worried much less about and sought to delimit less thoroughly. The scope of executive power and its accountability are however endemic problems, which arise within federal and non-federal states. Nor are these issues unique to common law constitutional orders. Problems concerning the nature and delimitation of executive power also arise

in civil law jurisdictions and in the European Union. Despite the historical constitutional focus on legislative power, it is executive authority which seems in the early 21st-century to be the more threatening, especially in the wake of the Iraq war, and the Guantanamo Bay detainees. This book addresses two sets of questions that are under-researched in constitutional scholarship. What is the proper scope of executive authority, how is executive power delimited, and how should it be defined? How is executive authority best held to account, politically and legally? These questions are both descriptive and normative and they are addressed accordingly in each of the chapters by leading public lawyers from a variety of jurisdictions. The book examines executive power in the United Kingdom from a British and from a distinctively Scottish perspective. There are chapters on the four common law jurisdictions of Australia, New Zealand, Canada, and the United States; on the four civil law jurisdictions of France, Germany, Italy, and Spain; and on the European Union. This insightful comparative perspective allows themes to be drawn together, and lessons extracted on the nature of executive power and its accountability.

The authors use real life scenarios to show how the tax applies in different situations, and provide checklists and flowcharts wherever helpful. All the SDLT forms with guidance on how to complete them, along with completed examples, is included as are relevant parts of the Finance Acts 2003 and 2004 as amended.

This new guide provides a comprehensive review of the various types of schemes available; advice on the professional and practical issues surrounding such schemes; an insight into how such schemes can be used to mitigate inheritance tax, pay for residential care, fund speculative investment, and help settle matrimonial settlements; and an examination of the safety procedures in force to protect clients including those of the FSA and various Codes of Conduct.

### **The WTO Anti-Dumping Agreement: A Commentary**

The Anti-Dumping Agreement is often perceived as being the most technical and controversial WTO agreement. While the basic concepts of dumping and resulting injury may appear deceptively simple, complex methodology related to the calculation of dumping and injury margins, as well as the very detailed procedural requirements that authorities need to comply with before taking anti-dumping action,

make the Anti-Dumping Agreement difficult to apply and understand in practice. While the book of necessity goes into great detail about the intricacies of anti-dumping law and practice, it attempts to explain the various concepts in a relatively non-technical manner by means of simplified examples that are easy to grasp for experts and non-experts alike. The book also pays extensive attention to interpretations of the various provisions of the Anti-Dumping Agreement by WTO panels and the Appellate Body. There have been more WTO cases under the Anti-Dumping Agreement than under any other WTO Agreement, reflecting both the increased recourse to anti-dumping measures by WTO members all over the world and the complexity of abiding by the WTO rules. WTO Panels and the Appellate Body, called upon to review administrative determinations and aspects of national legislation, have done a remarkable job in interpreting the WTO rules. For WTO members, wishing to impose anti-dumping measures in a WTO-consistent manner, knowledge not only of the Agreement itself, but also of such interpretations, is therefore a must.

### **International Copyright and Neighbouring Rights: The Berne Convention and Beyond, 2nd edition**

This magisterial commentary deals both with the history and with the modern application of the major international agreements affecting copyright and related rights. In particular, it analyses the interpretation and application of the following conventions: the Berne Convention for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works 1886-1970, the Rome Convention for the Protection of Performers, Phonogram Producers and Broadcasting Organisations 1961, the WIPO Copyright and Performances and Phonograms Treaties 1996 and the TRIPS Agreement (so far as it affects copyright and related rights). The organization of the text separates historical review from doctrinal analysis of the current application of the Berne Convention's provisions. The latter exposes gaps and ambiguities in the current text and, in a third section to each of the central chapters, considers the extent to which subsequent international instruments have resolved those questions. Issues concerning new technologies and digital networks thus receive in-depth treatment. The authors analyse questions of subject matter coverage, copyright ownership, duration, nature and scope of rights, and exceptions and limitations to copyrights protection. Extensive analysis of private international law matters also figures prominently in this edition, with two chapters

devoted to problems of international jurisdiction and choice of law. The book contains a helpful compilation of relevant treaties and related materials, while a companion website to the book will supplement these with a collection of the travaux préparatoires of the Berne Convention itself.

At present these relations are primarily governed by market forces, with little regulatory interference at the international level. In the light of numerous financial crises, this abstinence must be seriously questioned. Starting with an analysis of the regulatory problems at the international level, with only minimal powers entrusted to international organisations, this book develops various possibilities for reform. On the basis of an historical analysis, the book first adopts a comparative approach to national attempts to regulate international financial markets, then outlines the potential of relevant institutions (such as the European Central Bank, Basel Committee, IMF and World Bank) and finally develops a policy perspective. It seeks to provide a framework for analysing options for the regulation of international financial markets, from a public international law and comparative law perspective.

The book is accompanied by a regularly updated companion website.

### **International Tax Law**

With a century of solid theory behind it, tax law at the threshold of the twenty-first century confronts a new reality: the weakening of the tenacious link between the sovereignty of states and taxation. Yet it is to the continuity of certain themes and principles inherent in the various national tax systems that tax law scholarship continues to look, even as it develops new principles designed to meet the expanding processes of internationalisation. This collection of eleven essays offers an expert comparative analysis, conducted by a sample of the best international tax law scholars, of the fundamental theory of tax law and of the prospects in the near future of tax legislative systems. The emphasis falls naturally on

tax theory, jurisprudence, and legislative development in the Member States of the European Union (particularly in Italy, Germany, and Spain), where the process of tax harmonisation has been under way for many years. The effect of these processes, via the relevant tax treaties, on the tax systems of Japan and the United States provides a secondary emphasis. Practitioners and academics in tax law will find in this book an invaluable understanding of the challenges that tax law theory strives to meet at this crucial moment of economic history. The essays present a full and reliable exposition of the current theoretical approaches adopted by the various schools of thought in the field, as well as of the main contributions of jurisprudence. Extensive bibliographies are included. This volume translates and summarizes material in the editor's major five-volume work *Trattato di diritto tributario* (1994). Professor Amatucci has added an important new preface.

### **Privacy and the Press, 2nd edition**

The purpose of this book is to consider whether the existing law in England and Wales is adequate to protect the privacy of the individual against the intrusion by the press. The nature and extent of existing protection and

what alternatives there may be is considered thoroughly. Press intrusion and its general behaviour receive particular attention through sections on the Press Complaints Commission, its Code of Practice and whether self-regulation is favourable over legislative control. Various existing laws are discussed to establish whether or not they are adequate to protect privacy: confidentiality, with a reference to the equitable origins and its modern day criteria. It is very much a case-by-case distinction with an emphasis on the public interest defence but confidentiality is probably the closest protection of privacy that we have at the present. Copyright is also considered, with regard to the written word (personal letters) and the spoken word (interviews). Also the intrusion by publication of photographs is a matter that is raised. There are various common law remedies that may protect privacy, such as nuisance, but this has limitations. Some of these may have been resolved by statute. There will be a consideration of other existing legal aspects possibly protecting privacy, concluding that the general assumption that there is no actual law of privacy. This is not intended to be a substitute for a textbook on Tort. Future legal developments will be addressed with an outline of how the Human Rights Act will work and an examination of whether it will affect the press and privacy. Particular considera-

tion will be given to the task of the judiciary to balance freedom of expression with the right to privacy. This new edition should be useful reading for the press, lawyers advising the press and those that need protection from the press.

**Licensing Law Handbook: A practical guide to liquor and entertainment licensing**

The Licensing Act 2003 has introduced major reforms to licensing law and procedure. The Licensing Law Handbook is a concise guide to the new law and procedures. It contains the essential information that a practitioner will need in order to answer day to day questions. It provides a detailed and clear explanation of the new system of licensing, including: the nature of the various forms of authorisation for licensable activities under the Act, how to apply for an authorisation, the forms to use, operating schedules, how to object to an application, offences, closure powers, and appeals. The Handbook includes copies of the main Regulations made under the Act and extracts from the Secretary

of State's Guidance. The Licensing Law Handbook should be the first choice for any practitioner seeking up to date guidance on licensing practice.

**Justice for Crimes against Humanity**

Edited by Mark Lattimer and Philippe Sands, Hart Publishing, Paperback, ISBN 1-84113-568-2, due February 2005, c.£25.00

The aim of this book is to assess recent developments in international law seeking to bring an end to impunity by bringing to justice those accused of war crimes and crimes against humanity. The book was originally conceived while the editors were engaged, in different capacities, in proceedings relating to the detention of Senator Pinochet in London. The vigorous public debate that attended that case - and related developments in international criminal justice, such as the creation of the International Criminal Court and the trial of former President Milosevic - demonstrate the close connections between the law and wider political or moral questions. In the field of international criminal justice there appeared, therefore, a clear need to distinguish legal from essentially political issues - promoting the application of the law in an impartial and apolitical manner - while at the same time enabling each to legitimately inform the development of the other.
